**When & Where:** 3pm on October 5, 2019 on College Ave, Blacksburg

**Who & What:** Individuals and relay teams dressed as dung beetles compete to see who can roll a ball of "dung" down College Avenue the fastest!! Racers will use two sticks (to mimic a dung beetle's back legs) to push a 2-4 ft. dung ball through a series of obstacles and across a finish line.



## Categories

**Age groups/# Racers:** YOUTH (Ages 10-16) and ADULTS (Ages 17 and up) - Individuals and Teams (4 participants)

**Prizes:** Prizes will be given for **Fastest Dung Roller** for each individual and each team race in each age group.

- Racers must stay in their lane.
- Dung balls must remain on the ground at all times.
- Dung balls may only be pushed and maneuvered with the sticks provided.
- All racers must be dressed as dung beetles!!\*
